COLORADO HUMAN TRAFFICKING COUNCIL

Colorado: Colorado has a Human Trafficking Council that was established through legislation in 2014. They are also an Improving Outcomes Grantee through the US Dept. of Justice Office for Victims of Crime where they use an interdisciplinary, comprehensive joint response between their law enforcement and child welfare departments to prevent and reduce the impact of child/youth human trafficking. This collaborative joint effort is through their Colorado Dept. of Human Services, Dept. of Child Welfare, and Dept. of Public Safety, Division of Criminal Justice. As part of this effort, they use a three-prong training approach including the use of a train-the-trainer model and the creation of online self-paced training modules. In addition, they are launching in November a survivor-informed statewide public awareness campaign. Maria Trujillo is the Human Trafficking Program Manager who oversees and coordinates the work of the Colorado Human Trafficking Council and also established the National Compendium for Statewide Anti-Trafficking Initiatives.
