The Louisiana Child and Youth Trafficking Collaborative (LCYTC) is a multi-year 1.6 million dollar project to improve outcomes of child and youth victims of human trafficking. The project is administered by the Louisiana Governor's Office in collaboration with the Louisiana Alliance of Children's Advocacy Centers.

INCREASE the number of trained staff statewide (case management)

INCREASE child and youth trafficking training and awareness

IMPLEMENT risk screening tool for increased identification

IMPROVE and **SUPPORT** a multi-disciplinary response and service delivery

SUPPORT data collection

ENHANCE statewide collaboration and knowledge of available resources
